

Commodore's Message

Omena Bay Saturday, December 1, 1984

Over Labor Day weekend Rat and I picked up all the records from Fred and immediately brought them back to Cincinnati so that we could get a good start on the 1985 season.

As I started to read over the files and records, I noticed that our first meeting was held in the Basler's living room on Wednesday, August 6, 1947. At that meeting the "Leelanau Yacht Club" was formed with Gus Rogers as Commodore, Bob Dressel as Vice Commodore, Janey Basler as Secretary, Joe Cloud as Treasurer, Mary Moore as Vice Secretary/Treasurer, and Billy Renz as Junior Commodore. Here it is some 37 years later and that same Billy Renz is now Commodore. How time flies when you're having fun.

Many waves have gone around, under and past the dock in those 37 years - memories and friendships that will be with me always. August 18, 1947 a committee was appointed to contact Hector Carmichael about the "Pavillion" as a possible home for our new yacht club. On June 22, 1948 the Pavillion had been secured from Mr. Carmichael with a two year lease for one dollar a year. Our first meeting in the new clubhouse was held on July 6, 1948 and at that time, after much discussion, the members voted that our yacht club be known as the Omena Yacht Club. Then some two days later the name was changed again to the Omena-Traverse Yacht Club. I could go on and on about all the blood, sweat and tears that were given freely by the parents and kids in those early years - but I am sure that everyone, throughout the years, who has helped to make the OTYC last are as proud as I am of the Omena-Traverse Yacht Club.

Well here it is November of 1984 and the clubhouse has been put to bed for another winter, but not before the front porch was rebuilt under the fine supervision of Bob Harper. About 2/3 of the beams were replaced and a new floor installed and painted. Bob was able to get all of this accomplished for about 10% under what the Board had appropriated. Much thanks from all of us, Bob!




exciting and fun programs for all. This winter we anticipate a bang-up Breeze under new editors Mary Tonneberger and Frank Gaffney.

Harold and I had one complaint. On account of the high living, we gained weight!"


Everyone will be waiting for Leona's first hand account this coming summer on their exciting adventure.

Mike and Kathy have been traveling a lot, visiting Missie in Washington and Jeff in Texas for parents' week.







KEVIN RAY Sailing Instructor






BILL RENZ **Tennis Instructor**




1984 OTYC Tennis Report




