
Honoring Marion Kirk Jones




Desert Dance Theater will celebrate Marion Jones' 90th Birthday on Saturday June 4th 2011 at the Tempe Center for the Arts.

Marion was a student of modern dance pioneers Martha Graham, Doris Humphrey, Charles Weidman, and Hanya Holm. In ballet, she studied with George Balanchine.

In 1979 she helped found Desert Dance Theatre, and later became its Artistic Director while serving as Professor of Dance at Arizona State University. Desert Dance Theatre is one of Arizona's oldest modern dance companies. Twenty of Marion's dances are included in its repertory.

We are pleased to welcome Jim Champion back this summer as Director of the Youth Program. The program will focus on sailing and tennis with a lot of extra fun thrown in.





Nominating Committee







Are you ready for our first ever, family friendly OTYC (On The Youthful Course) Fitness Event?
